A resident in the 500 block of Woodward Street was the victim of an identity theft. Several credit cards and bank accounts had balances totaling over \$20,000 in another person's name but using the victim's social security number. The victim was provided an identity theft packet and was referred to the Federal Trade Commission for further action.

A resident in the 1400 block of Trailside was the victim of an identity where the victim was contacted by a collections agency for a Sprint account that was in arrears by over \$2,000. The victim was provided an identity theft packet and had already contacted the Federal Trade Commission.

On April 10th, the owner of a home in the 1900 block of Monhegan Avenue reported damage to the home and reported the theft of several items from inside the home. The victim believes the previous renter was responsible for the damage and theft. The victim was referred to civil court.

On Saturday, April 15th at 10:12 a.m., an SUV was rear ended by a car in the 700 block of Indiana Avenue. The SUV was attempting to make a left turn into a parking lot when it was struck from behind. No injuries were reported and no citations were issued.
