Daniel J. Postma, 38, 514 Chestnut Lane, Beecher, Illinois, was arrested on Monday, May 29th and charged with aggravated domestic battery and domestic battery. Police were called to the residence for a domestic disturbance at 7:12 p.m. and discovered 2 family members were allegedly battered by Postma who left the residence prior to police arrival. Postma was stopped by Will County Sheriff's police on 394 and Burville Road and turned over to Beecher authorities. The 2 victims declined medical attention at the scene and Postma was later transferred to the Will County Adult Detention Facility to await a bond hearing.

Monica R. Rekau, 27, 1412 W. Broadview Avenue, Crete, Illinois, was arrested on Monday, May 29th at 9:49 a.m. at Dixie Highway and Miller Street for driving while license suspended and speeding. She was released on bond pending a court appearance.

Dorian M. Hosch, 45, 7308 S. Emerald Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, was arrested on Saturday, May 27th at 10:05 p.m. in the 1300 block of Dixie Highway for driving while license suspended and failure to secure a child in a child restraint seat. He was released on bond pending a court appearance.

Marc A. Bennett, 34, 320 S. Oak, Manteno, Illinois, was arrested on Friday, May 26th at 7:21 p.m. in the 1200 block of Dixie Highway for violation of the sex offender registration act. Police were called to the area to check on a suspicious person when they discovered he failed to update his sex offender registration. He was later transported to the Will County Adult Detention Facility to await a bond hearing.

Police responded to the 300 block of Mallards Cove for a domestic dispute on Thursday, May 25th at 10:02 p.m. 2 victims were reportedly battered by a male subject who left the residence prior to police arrival. The alleged offender could not be located and police are continuing the investigation.

Approximately 15 cars were burglarized early Saturday morning on May 27th. Several vehicles parked in the 1300, 1400 and 1500 blocks of Fox Hound Trail and vehicles in the 300 block and 1500 block of Mallards Cove were broken into. Other locations include the 300 block of Spring Cove; 200 block of Timbers Bluff Trail; 1500 block of Saddle Run Lane and the 1300 block of Somerset Drive. Some of the vehicles sustained damage and some were unlocked. Cash, credit cards, laptop computers were among items stolen. Police are investigating and anyone with information regarding the break-ins is asked to contact the police department.
